Connecting Sebastopol Community Meet-Up

Our first Sebastopol Community Meet-Up for 2025 was held on 21 February at Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre. It was a lovely opportunity to catch-up with residents and representatives from a range of local organisations including Sebastopol Men's Shed, Sebastopol Historical Society, Sebastopol Fire Brigade, Sebastopol Senior Citizens, Open Door and Op Shop, Journey Early Learning and Relationships Australia. The group discussed that applications are currently open for the City of Ballarat Community Impact Grants, which allow local not-for-profit groups to apply for funding to deliver projects that build community capacity and foster community connections. We talked about this being an opportunity for us to work together on a project for the Burra. Sebastopol resident Eileen had an idea for a 'Celebration of Sebastopol' event which was enthusiastically received by everyone and inspired some exciting and creative brainstorming!

Some of the ideas included:

- Offering free food and activities so that everyone can come along and enjoy the event, no matter their circumstances
- Encouraging local community groups to host stalls to showcase what they offer and how people can get involved
- Engaging with local multicultural groups in the event planning and delivery to ensure inclusivity and celebrate the diverse Burra community
- Performances, 'come and try' activities, and talks by local guest speakers
- Sebastopol merchandise to encourage Burra pride

Girl Guides Summer Fun!

It's hard to believe the Sebastopol & Delacombe Girl Guides only resumed for the year in February. The persistent heat of the Ballarat summer set the perfect stage for a month packed with exciting water activities. Our very first Thursday was a scorching 34-degree day, providing the perfect opportunity to kick off the year with a Water Activity Night. The girls had a blast with water balloon tosses, sponge bucket relays, water pistol challenges, overhead cup-passing games, and even launching a bottle rocket.



A much-anticipated annual event was the friendly competition with the local Scouts, where multiple teams of Guides and Scouts built ballistas using poles and ropes, and capable of launching water balloons at each other across the field. Each team put their knotting and construction skills to the test before enjoying the fun of seeing who could achieve the most accurate aiming, or who would get the wettest. Our favourite grassy knoll in Sebastopol provided the perfect slope for iceblocking, one of our favourite Guiding activities. This involves sitting on a large block of ice and sliding down the side of the hill, a fantastic way to cool off on a hot evening.

The adventure continued with canoeing at St George's Lake in Creswick. Ideal weather conditions

allowed the Guides to practice paddling techniques, master safe canoe transfers, and even take on the extra challenge of deliberately capsizing and working together to swim their canoes back to shore. This thrilling exercise developed water survival skills, confidence, resilience and teamwork.

The Guides also made a difference in the Sebastopol community by participating in the Clean Up Australia program. Collecting bags of rubbish and recyclables at Phoenix Community College, Victory Park, and nearby streets, they demonstrated their commitment to caring for the environment and providing service. And after all that hard work on yet another hot night, what better way to cool down than some time at the water park?



It's been an action-packed start to the term for Guides throughout Ballarat. Sebastopol offers a Guide group for 10-16 year olds, and a separate group for 5-9 year olds, both on Thursday nights. Sebastopol Mens Shed News

Our Shed now has three licensed Test and Tag operators who can check any electrical products that you have, including extension leads. It give you peace of mind that appliances are safe to use. We can do the whole process in one day, for low cost. Any members of the community can bring their appliances to the front office on Wednesdays from 9 am (we close at 2 pm), or to our Saturday markets.



Test and Tag is the name given to the process of checking the safety of portable electrical appliances. It involves two parts: inspecting the appliance for any damage, followed by electrically testing it with a Portable Appliance Tester. Once tested, the item has a tag secured to it to testing details. Our charge is very modest for this process. We prefer cash, but

snipper serviced. We encourage recycling of old mowers and would be very grateful if you can give us your old mowers, so that we can resurrect them for someone else. Maybe you have something metal that requires some welding repairs. If that garden furniture, or whatever, is broken, don't throw it out, but get it to the Shed for some expert spot welding, even on very light metal.

The Shed has been granted Deductible Gift Recipient status, which means that anyone can make donations to the Shed and we issue tax-deductible receipts. Donations are always welcomed by the Shed, as we are a self-funded operation.

Wayne Jones JP (pictured) coordinates a dedicated team of volunteers who provide JP services at Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre sites in Sebastopol and Delacombe. The need for their services has grown exponentially over the last few years, with 1048 people attending in 2024, compared to 214 in 2022, and 9431 documents signed in 2024, compared to 1697 in 2022. Sebastopol Community Hub Update



A construction milestone has been reached for the Sebastopol Community Hub with pouring of the concrete slab. It is expected the structural steel framing will be complete in autumn as the design starts to become a reality with the project on track to open in early 2026.

The project, on the corner of Vickers and Beverin Streets, will bring enormous benefit to the southern suburbs of Ballarat with construction of an integrated community hub. Once complete, the facility will provide a new home for the Sebastopol Senior Citizens and community groups that used the former Sebastopol Senior Citizens Centre, include a 66-place kindergarten, Maternal and Child Health consulting rooms, and provide spaces for community groups and organisations to run activities, programs and services for the community.

Key deliverables of the project

- A new home for the Sebastopol Senior Citizens
- A 66-place kindergarten for education and play based learning
- Two consulting rooms for maternal and child health and other family-focused services
- New bookable spaces for community groups and organisations to run event and activities including three multipurpose activity rooms, and a large hall
- Spaces for early childhood programs and services including parent groups and supported playgroup

The project is jointly funded by the City of Ballarat (up to \$5 million), the Federal Government (\$4.5 million) via the Investing in Our Communities program and the State Government (\$4.5 million) via the Building Blocks Capacity program.



A new church in town



In the winter of 2024, a new church began worshipping on Sundays at the Open Door on Albert Street. Under the leadership of Father Jithin James, the Saint Severios Jacobite Syriac Orthodox Church has opened its doors to a new congregation.

The Jacobite Syriac Orthodox Church (JSOC) has it's roots in India, where tradition says that St. Thomas (the one who "doubted") came as a missionary.

The liturgy of the worship service is very old, tracing itself back to St. Ignatius of Antioch in the first century BCE. This makes them related to the Coptic Church in Egypt. The Open Door is thrilled to welcome this church community to Sebastopol, and is looking forward to a long relationship with them. 
Become a Dementia Friend



Historically Speaking

The Sebastopol Avenue of Honour - Part I From Cheshunt Street to Birdwood Avenue

Have you ever wondered how the streets of the Borough were named? This is the story of how one well known street came by its name.

The deaths and injury of so many young men during the first World War left a huge sense of loss and tragedy in the hearts of the communities and families from which these soldiers came. People were keen to find ways to commemorate and honour the service of these men.

Avenues of Honour were one way communities sought to show their support. Ballarat's well known Arch of Victory marks the start of the city's Avenue of Honour. It is thought to be the earliest known and Australia's longest of Avenue Of Honour at 22 kilometres long. The idea for the avenue, the subsequent fund-raising and planting were the work of the staff of the clothing firm, E. Lucas & Co.

The Borough of Sebastopol has it's own Avenue of Honour which ran along what is now known as Birdwood Avenue. On Wednesday July 17th, 1917 a public meeting, chaired by by borough Mayor Cr. Jones was held to discuss the proposal to follow the example of the employees of Lucas and Co to plant an avenue of trees to honour the enlistment of local soldiers.

A week later a committee presented their findings to another public meeting. While they recommended that what was then known as Cheshunt Street as the best site nominations were also received for Albert and Hertford Street. After a vote by all those present Cheshunt Street was chosen. Things moved quickly. Another committee was formed to mark out the placement of the trees and oversee a working bee to

prepare for the planting of the trees. The price of a tree was set at 10/6 and donors could nominate in whose honour the tree would be planted. There were many volunteers and the preparations were rapidly completed with the official tree planting conducted on Saturday, August 4th, 1917.

It was reported in *The Courier* on August 6th, 2017 that "Practically the whole of the available population of Sebastopol turned out on that afternoon for the opening the Avenue of Honour commemoration of the soldiers from the borough who are fighting the Empire's battles abroad. Although the movement was only initiated a couple of weeks ago the work of the organisation was so well carried out — thanks largely to the efforts of the Mayor (Cr. J. E. Jones) and the secretary (Mr N. Howell) — that everything was in readiness for the planting of 120 trees . . . holes had been sunk, tree guards erected, name plates prepared and a substantial notice board erected bearing the following inscription."

Birdwood Avenue

This avenue of trees was planted by the residents of Sebastopol
In honour of our brave boys who volunteered to fight
For King, Empire and Freedom
Mayor J.E. Jones Chairman, N. Howell Secretary
4th August 1917

The name of the street was changed from Cheshunt Street to what we now know as Birdwood Avenue as a "compliment" to General Sir William Birdwood. Who was General Birdwood? Find out in Part II of this article in the next Sebastopol Community News.



Historically Speaking

The Ballarat Ranger Military Museum


The Colony of Victoria separated from the Colony of New South Wales on 1 July 1851, that day becoming known as Separation Day. In 1854, in response to the perceived threat during the Crimean War (1853-56) that 'the Russians are Coming', the government of the Colony of Victoria received notification from the British Government that it could raise its own Defence Forces. The Victorian Defence Act of 1854 saw the raising of Volunteer Rifle Regiments in Melbourne and Geelong, along with Artillery batteries around Port Phillip Bay.



On 9 August 1858, the Ballarat Volunteer Rifle Regiment held its first meeting. Men from Sebastopol would soon join the Volunteers. The Regiment was known for most of its existence as the Ballarat Volunteer Rangers. The Volunteers closed in 1883 and reopened as paid Militia in 1884. Ballarat's unit became the 3rd (Ballarat) Battalion, Victorian Rifles. In 1885/86 the Drill Hall, later named Ranger Barracks, was built. There were a few names changes until Federation in 1901 when the unit became the 3rd Battalion, Infantry Brigade, under the new Federal Government.

The Australian Army was raised on 1 March 1903 and Ballarat's unit became the 7th Australian





Infantry Regiment. Compulsory Military Training for young boys from 12 years of age began in 1912, expanding the Militia. After war was declared in August 1914, many Sebastopol men joined the 8th Battalion raised in Ballarat.

Post-WW1, Ballarat's unit was the 8th Battalion (City of Ballarat Regiment), which served in WW2 until being disbanded at the end of the war. The Citizen Military Forces were

re-raised in 1948. Ballarat was amalgamated with Mildura to form the 8th/7th Battalion (North Western Victorian Regiment). This changed in 1960 to the 2nd Battalion, The Royal Victoria Regiment and changed again in 1987 to the 8th/7th Battalion, The Royal Victoria Regiment, the current name.

The Ballarat Ranger Military Museum was opened in the old Ranger Barracks (now Dan Murphy's) in 1987. When the old barracks were sold in 2001, the museum moved to the Sebastopol Hall, known to locals as the Sebastopol RSL. The new Ranger Barracks (left), at the corner of Sturt Street and Ring Road Alfredton, were completed in 2003. During the building phase of the new barracks, a WW2 hut from the Ballarat airport, which had been used as a storage shed at the old Ranger Barracks, was moved to the Russell Street, Newington, Depot for use by the Army Cadets. In 2004 the hut was moved to the new barracks and set up as the museum. The museum was officially opened on the battalion's 150th Birthday on 9 August 2008.

The museum, which holds memorabilia from as far back as the 1800s, is open Thursday afternoon 1 – 4pm, the fourth Sunday morning 9am to noon, or by appointment.
